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A Study of Success Efficiency in the "Kendo"

1. Purpose

We verificated in this study the relation between one's action and other's one of the ones of " $Kend\bar{o}$ ".

I added, that is, the verification what mutual relation exists between the speed of one's "shinai" and of others when one succeeds in or fails in "Harai-men" and "Men-suriage-men" and "Kote-suriage-kote" which are included among "offensive skill" and "defensive skill".

2. Results

Whether about "offensive skill" and about "defensive skill" and whether when either of them is done successfully and unsuccessfully, the mutual relations between the speed of one's "shinai" and others one are different each other, but it was, for the present, proved that the relations are within the limit of the coefficient. From this we can know that the "offensive skill" should be done as sooner as one can than others action, is very important. And about "defensive skill", we realized that it is important to make other's action ineffectual and to make effective "da-totsu" answering other's action as soon as possible.

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
