The first is the general introduction to the whole; in that I have brought out some problematic points and thereby given an outline of the subjects I will deal with. In the second I have tried to explain one important phase of the method used in the "German ideology, (1845-6)" the phase, namely the point of view which takes human beings as—so to speak—an absolute axis of the history.
