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Sentence Structure as a Function

This paper is a sequel to my earlier paper, "The Problem of Meaning (I)", *Tetsugaku (Mita)*, vol. 50 (1967), pp. 129-149. In that paper I intended to show the grammatical structure of a sentence clarified by the transformational grammar is different from its logical structure in the sense of modern logic. In Section 1, of this paper I point out that the transformational analysis of a sentence depends upon the traditional conception that a sentence consists of a subject and a predicate. In Section 2., I introduce some concepts in modern logic such as individual variable, form and function, and in Section 3., making use of the notion of function I try to state some new rules of syntax, by which the structural meaning of a sentence will become clearer.
