オーエン・ラティモア教授著作目録

石川 忠雄

オーエン・ラティモア教授が現在アメリカにおけるもつとも著名なアジア問題専門家の一人であることは、ここで改めて紹介するまでもないであろう。教授は、内外蒙古から新疆地方を中心に、夫人のエリナー・ラティモアとともに、ながい年月をかけて現地で調査と研究をすすめ、とくに中國邊境地域の研究については他の學者の追隨を許さぬ名聲を保持している。

ラティモア教授は、1900年7月29日、Washington D. C. に生れ、幼年時代を中國で送つたが、歸米後1919年再び中國にもどり、1925年まで天津・上海・北京などでジャーナリズム、實業に關係し、1926年から27年にかけて蒙古及び新疆へ最初の旅行をこころみた。その後、米國にもどり、1928年及び29年をハーヴァード大學の Research Student として過し、さらに1930—31年はハーヴァード・燕京研究所 (Harvard-Yenching Institute) の research fellow として、また1931—33年は Guggenheim Foundation の research fellow として、ひきつづき北京で研究に従事した。1934年、太平洋問題調査會 (Institute of Pacific Relations) と關係をもち、その機關誌 “Pacific Affairs” の編集責任者となり、アメリカの中國學界に確固たる地位を築くとともに、政治的にもその活動を開始するようになった。すなわち、1941年には蔣介石の政治顧問、1943年には Pacific Operations, Office of War Information の director となり、1944年には、副大統領ヘンリー・ウォーレスのシベリヤ中國旅行に隨行し、さらに1945年にはアメリカの日本賠償調査團の經濟顧問として來日している。とくに、第二次大戦末期におけるラティモア教授の言動はこの時期から戦争直後にかけてのアメリカの對華政策をみる場合に、見逃すことのできない重要な意味をもっているといえるのである。戦後、いわゆるマッカーサー旋風にまきこまれ、非常な困難にあつたことは、われわれの記憶にあらたなところである。現在は、ジョンズ・ホプキンス大學 (Johns Hopkins University) 教授の地位にある。

以上がラティモア教授の經歷の概要であるが、これからも知られるように、教授の經歷は多彩をきわめており、すぐれた學者としてアメリカ近代中國學界の發展に有力な役割を果たしてきたばかりでなく、現實のアメリカの對華政策の展開のうえにも影響をあたえてきたのであつて、この意味において、ラティモア教授の研究及び活動は十分注目に値するも

のといわなければならない。しかし、教授の著作活動は、極めて多方面にわたり、その数も非常に多く、その著作目録を作成することは容易なことではない。さいわい、一昨年機会をえて渡米し、昨年一月ジョンズ・ホプキンス大學にラティモア教授を訪問した際、教授の著作目録をほしい旨申し入れたところ、快く承諾され、エリナー・ラティモア夫人がその作成にあたられた結果、昨年4月ボストンで開かれたThe Association for Asian Studiesの大會でそれを頂戴することができた。いまここに發表しようとするのがその著作目録である。わたくしは、ラティモア教授御夫妻の御協力と御好意に深く感謝するとともに、この目録がわが國の中國研究者にとつて役立つれば大變幸せであると考えている。
